In 1998, Dr. Tim Henschel felt called to provide pediatric care to children in Williamson County who could not access medical care because of their lack of insurance. Thanks to incredible founders and donor support, Mercy Children's Clinic opened in a small house in the heart of Franklin in 1999.

After more than a decade of providing excellent healthcare for children, Mercy Children's Clinic again felt called to serve the whole family, thus beginning the journey into becoming a Federally Qualified Health Center.

In 2013 we transitioned from a children's clinic to Mercy Community Healthcare and began providing comprehensive, integrated healthcare services to adults while maintaining the ministry on which we were founded.

Mercy envisions a comprehensive community healthcare facility serving over 15,000 patients annually. For generations to come, Mercy will continue meeting individuals' and families' physical, mental and spiritual needs through the healing power of Jesus Christ to the glory of God. Mercy relies on generous donors to provide \$1 million a year to enable us to serve as a safety net for our patients who most need our help.
